Missionary's Message

Last month I shared that if we boil it all down, the root cause of sin in our lives is misplaced love and misplaced fear. This basically means that we love and fear other things and people over God. Many folks would call this idolatry. I agree that it is indeed idolatry and we must be keenly aware of it in our lives. We must confess these sins of misplaced love and fear and allow God to cleanse us and renew our hearts and minds to love and fear Him above all other things and people.

This month, I would like for us to consider the role misplaced love and fear plays in the area of church revitalization. To revitalize simply means to give new life to something. When it comes to churches that are in plateau and decline, we know that unless the Spirit of God breathes new life into His people, true and lasting revitalization will not take place. Revitalization is a work of God. However, the church must intentionally, prayerfully, and humbly position herself before God in order to cooperate with Him in the work He desires to accomplish.

When we intentionally position ourselves before God in a humble and prayerful way, He will speak. He will show us how He desires for us to join Him in the work of revitalization. He will most certainly reveal to us what we need to give-up and change in order to achieve greater Kingdom results. Here is where we need to ask some crucial questions:

- *Will we do what God asks of us?
- *Do we love God more than our current ways of doing things?
- *Will we fear God more than the opinions of others?
- *Do we love our comfort more than being stretched to achieve the mission of Jesus?
- *Do we love our current programs and activities too much to change them for the sake of those in our community who need to hear the Gospel?
- *Do we love our facilities more than the people in the community around us?
- *Are we afraid that God may lead us to let go of material possessions that are dear to us for the sake of advancing His Kingdom?

When we seek God's face, and He reveals Himself to us in fresh ways desiring to do a new work in and through us, we must be careful to guard against misplaced love and fear. For if we love and fear anything else over God (no matter how good it may appear to be), we will miss out on seeing Him do a new work. May our churches be yielded to Him, loving and fearing Him above all else. To God Be The Glory!
