PRAYING FOR VITAL HEALTHY CHURCHES NETWORKING TO FULFILL THE GREAT COMMISSION

The above title contains the vision statement of the South Roanoke Baptist Association: *Vital, healthy churches networking to fulfill the Great Commission*. It also contains the function of the SRBA Prayer Team: praying for the vision. Briefly stated, the function statement of the prayer team is to lead in maintaining on-going prayer for the churches in the area of Kingdom needs, impacting lostness in Eastern North Carolina and encouraging the development of prayer coordinators in all SRBA churches.

This year the team's six members (Pat Boone, Corby Bunting, Peggy Cochran, Yvette Ingram, Yolanda Keyes and Gail Trueblood) have committed to carrying out the team function by actively pursuing the following goals:

First, establishing and maintaining a personal connection between a member of the prayer team and a pastor-designated representative from his church to the team. At least once a month the prayer team member and the church representative communicate with each other to give and receive prayer requests and praise reports. Together, at the prayer team's monthly meeting, we pray for, and rejoice over, the requests and answers to prayer. Additionally, team members send out
