Interim Associational Missionary Message February 2024

President John Kennedy in 1961 made it a matter of national pride to send men to the Moon. He said, "We choose to go to the Moon in this decade and do the other things, not because they are easy, but because they are hard." I felt a sense of national pride on July 20, 1969 when Neil Armstrong stepped on the surface of the Moon. The ninth and last round-trip to Earth's natural satellite was in 1972.

NASA's plan to go back to the Moon in 2025 is crumbling. They already built the world's most powerful rocket, but funding cutbacks suggest it will be a rocket with no place to go. Private enterprises are building their own rockets; some to give tourists rides in space. Sadly, there is no unifying vision, though the countdown to 2025 continues as if something meaningful will occur.

We are in a countdown for the calling of a new Associational Mission Strategist (AMS). Are we prepared for his arrival? What if our approach mirrored our country's method for space exploration? Without a unified vision, churches would build their own rockets, each with different destinations. Many would expect the Search Team to first find a powerful rocket, and then we will determine where it will go.

Each church has different gifts (Romans 12:6), but one commission: *go and make disciples of all nations* (Matthew 28:19). Our unified vision becomes a matter of using diverse abilities to advance the Gospel. Only then can we have legitimate pride, not for what we have done individually, but corporately, for giving God all the glory. Though it will be hard, remember we serve a mighty God.

When the countdown is completed and the new AMS arrives, we can rejoice in having a faithful rocket to guide us to accomplish our vision: healthy churches networking to transform lives in fulfilling the Great Commission.

Keep the SON in your eyes.
