Interim Associational Missionary Message April 2024

Bernie Sanders, US Senator from Vermont, wants to revise the Fair Labor Standards Act definition of full-time employment from 40 hours per week to 32 hours, a 20% decrease. Workers would be paid the same amount for working 32 hours as they ldid for working 40 hours.

He wrote in the Washington Post (March 19th) that worker productivity has increased 400% since 1940, but workers are earning less money (when adjusted for inflation); and more than half of full-time employees were working more than 40-hour weeks.

His proposal sounds appealing. There are, however, drawbacks. Automated self-check-out in stores is replacing the need for cashiers. No job, no money. If cashiers did go to a 32-hour week, businesses might either cut hours or hire another worker.

God's Word is our fair labor standards act. Salvation is a gift from God (Eph. 2:8), not a wage for our work. On the other hand, once saved, we are expected to work for the Lord with all our heart (Col. 3:23). Is it possible for an individual, church, or association to work less, and expect God to be pleased? I think not.

No time to reduce our efforts. A multitude of lost people are in the fields. Workers are few (cf., Matt. 9:37), but together the Lord can use us to do more than we could alone. I am grateful for those saints and churches actively involved with our association to make Jesus known near and far. It is exciting to see cooperative efforts developing among churches that can bear more fruit than the sum of individual efforts for imissions like collecting food for the Baptist Children's' Homes for coats for the homeless in New York City. See the article *Acts of Random Kindness* to stimulate thinking outside the box for more cooperative ways to advance the Kingdom.

Rampin' Up 2024

In 2012 the NC Baptist Aging Ministry (NCBAM) set a world record when churches built 321 ramps for older or handicapped individuals. The ramp building ministry is a way for people to see a demonstration of the Gospel, ministering even to "the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:40). Often "the least of these" cannot fully cover the cost of lumber, and many of our SRBA churches have funds to cover the deficit. The SRBA has financially assisted churches in this ministry.

This year NCBAM is encouraging churches to build a ramp during the ServeNC campaign in August 3-10, but it can be built whenever you can schedule the project. If you do not have enough people at your church to build a ramp, contact the SRBA and we can connect you to one of the churches who has a ramp building ministry.

SBC Disaster Relief – 40th Anniversary

The March/April issue of the Biblical Recorder had an article about the 40th anniversary of the NC Baptist Disaster Relief. The first NC response was when a tornado caused extensive damage in Robeson County. One of 11 twisters passed through the town of Red Springs on the evening of March 28,1984. By the next evening a NC Disaster Relief feeding unit was set up at FBC Red Springs to provide hot meals to residents.

SBC Disaster Relief began in 1967 when Texas Baptists responded to Hurricane Beulah. One task was to provide hot meals. It was done using the adage: start where you are – with what you have – and do something. A man was teaching RAs & GAs how to build a camp stove made out of a tin can. He got word of the need to feed survivors. The tin cans were loaded into his pickup truck. When he arrived at the Baptist site, the cans were used to provide a hot breakfast.

By 1984 NC Baptist Men had outfitted a tractor trailer as a mobile feeding unit. When it arrived in Robeson, 30 Baptist volunteers from around the state began providing hot meals for 300 people.

Here in North Carolina, you already have training opportunities to be involved in disaster relief. Now do something: get trained and respond when needed.

Interim AMS Activities: March 2024

Acts of Random Kindness

Dr. Bill Viel compiled a book on approaches to ministry evangelism and servant evangelism, coupling practical evangelism to any ministry or mission. The book, published in 2008, is entitled *Acts of Random Kindness: Can Change You, Your Church, and the Entire World.* Dr. Viel's approach is that evangelism is more about developing relationships than it is about knocking on a door. He rightly points out that doing ministry and acts of kindness is for the explicit purpose of telling people, "Jesus loves you." Many novel ideas are present in his book in a way for people to see a demonstration of the Gospel, and in a fun way.

Until he was called home in 2023, Dr. Viel lived in Rocky Mount. The North Roanoke Baptist Association was given permission to distribute his book; they have put each chapter on their website: https:///www.nrbaptistnc.org It is recommended you first download and read chapters 1 & 2 which explain the concepts of ministry evangelism and servant evangelism. Once read, you can better appreciate the examples and illustrations in chapters 3- 10.

The SRBA has two hard copies of the book that can be borrowed if your church is interested in exploring new ideas or new approaches to existing ministries.
